# **Crane Operator Certification Update**

On May 21, 2018, OSHA published a notice of proposed rulemaking (NPRM) titled "Cranes and Derricks in Construction: Operator Qualification." The summary states, "OSHA proposes to update its standard for cranes and derricks in construction by permanently extending and clarifying each employer's duty to ensure the competency of crane operators through required training, certification or licensing, and evaluation. OSHA is also proposing to remove an existing provision that requires different levels of certification based on rated lifting capacity of equipment. This proposal would clarify that while testing

organizations are not required to issue certifications distinguished by rated capacities, they are permitted to do so. Finally, it would establish minimum requirements for determining operator competency. OSHA believes that this proposal would maintain safety and health protections for workers while reducing employers' compliance burdens."

The deadline for submitting public comments was originally published as June 20, 2018; however, on June 18, OSHA announced the public comment deadline was being extended by 15 days to July 5, to allow parties affected by the rule additional time to review the proposed

ensure a robust future is to offer more opportunities for member input and involvement not just in a trustee board capacity. rule and collect information and data necessary for comment.

It remains unknown as to whether this latest rulemaking proposal will affect the November 10 crane operator certification compliance deadline. Last month, we also learned that NPCA's efforts to test and roll-out the new NCCCO TLL exam were successful. In fact, tests are now available for CCO Telescopic Boom-Swing Cab Restricted (TLL-R) and Telescopic Boom-Fixed Cab Restricted cranes (TSS-R), as outlined in a July 31 NPCA press release. To date, no testing sites are available in Ohio. We are monitoring news from OSHA and NPCA closely and will update our website and issue News Blasts via our group email server as any new developments are made known.

### **Respirable Silica Rule for General Industry & Maritime**


Most provisions of the standard for respirable crystalline silica in general industry and maritime became enforceable June 23, 2018. The standard establishes a new 8-hour, timeweighted average permissible exposure limit and action level. During the first 30 days of enforcement, OSHA offered compliance assistance for employers making good faith efforts to comply with the new standard. OSHA plans to issue interim enforcement guidance until a compliance directive on the new standard is finalized. For more information, read the news release at:

### New Members: Here We Grow Again!

The Ohio Precast Concrete Association welcomed another new member this quarter:

### Medical Marijuana in Ohio - Update

A recent Columbus Dispatch article reported that Ohio patients will not be able to buy Medical Marijuana on September 8, 2018, the date by which Ohio's medical cannabis program was to become "fully functional." Processors, or those who will turn cannabis plants into

edibles, oils, creams and tinctures, have yet to be selected. The 104 applicants were supposed to learn their outcome earlier this Spring, then in June. Mark Hamlin, senior policy adviser for the Department of Commerce, said processor licenses will be awarded in the coming weeks.

Ohio legalized medical marijuana in June, 2016. Over the past two years, the state has been working toward

setting up its own marijuana growers and dispensaries. While much of the focus has been on delays in awarding licenses, to date only two cultivators have been given the green light to grow marijuana, officials said. Those who have not received certificates of operation will now have to seek extensions before they can be inspected and approved. In addition, the patient registration portal has not yet come online.

Meanwhile, employers have been faced with reviewing their drug policies and deciding if and where changes should be made. Ohio's medical-marijuana law is loaded with protections for companies that want to stick with zero-tolerance policies when it comes to drugs, including marijuana. "Most [are] going to prohibit it for now, and they'll let employees know they run the risk of being terminated," predicted Justin Breidenbach, an assistant professor of accounting at Ohio Wesleyan University who studies the marijuana industry.

For the most part, state-court decisions have favored employers on issues involving hiring and firing related to a state's marijuana laws, according to the Legal Intelligencer, a legal website. Those rulings tend to emphasize that marijuana remains illegal under federal law regardless of what a state law allows.

Under Ohio's medical-marijuana law, employers can prohibit the use of marijuana by workers, discipline

workers for using the drug, and refuse to hire applicants if they use it. Workers fired for using marijuana probably wouldn't receive unemployment benefits and, if they were hurt on the job while under the influence, probably wouldn't receive workers' compensation benefits either. "Each business can decide what it wants to do," said Don Boyd, director of labor and legal affairs with the Ohio Chamber of Commerce.

NPCA offers a webinar, *Prescription Narcotics & Medical Marijuana: What Can Companies Do About This Safety Hazard?* It is presented by Julie Pace, Senior Member of The Cavanah Law Firm, in Phoenix, Arizona. Although recorded four years ago, as states began passage of medical and/or recreational marijuana usage laws, Ms. Pace's content remains useful to employers in Ohio today. For those who have not yet reviewed their drug policy considering the new medical marijuana law, the following sources will provide further insight.
